

O-Contemporary in partenership with Baró Galeria Hosts Grand Opening for their New Contemporary Art Gallery in Abu Dhabi

Abu Dhabi, May 16, 2025 – O-Contemporary, founded by His Excellency Dr. Obaid Al Ketbi in 2024 in partnership with Baró Galeria, founded by María Baró in 1999, proudly announces the launch of the first international contemporary art gallery in Abu Dhabi. This collaboration aims to create cultural bridges and foster dialogue between cultures, bringing together established and emerging artists from both the Middle East and the West, while also promoting regional art to an international level.

For the Grand Opening, the galleries invite you to The Other Side of the Moon, a group exhibition curated by Esmeralda Gómez Galera, Elena Belolípetskaia, and Mohammed Al Saqqa. The Other Side of the Moon marks the Grand Opening of a new cultural space in Abu Dhabi, inaugurated by Baró Galeria in collaboration with O-Contemporary. This group exhibition brings together artists from seven different countries, inviting visitors to follow a movement that shifts from the immediate landscapes around us to the distant realms of the cosmos.

Featuring works by artist such as Latifa Saeed, Adrian Pepe, Abdus Salaam, Mano Penalva, Jorge Rosano Gamboa, Tamara Kalo, Gary Hill, Mohammed Kazem, Christopher Benton, Néstor García, Elias Crespin, Eduardo Kac, Rasheed Araeen, and more - The exhibition unfolds across three interconnected chapters: from the immediacy of sand, desert, and surrounding landscape, to the human experience of wonder and searching, and finally to the mysteries of the Moon and the universe beyond.

At the heart of the exhibition lies the concept of Insān — the human being as a seeker, defined by the constant quest for the unknown. Through sculpture, installation, video, and mixed media, the participating artists explore how this restless impulse shapes our relationship with the environment, memory, and the cosmos.

In the first chapter, visitors encounter works that engage directly with the tangible — the materiality of sand, the tension of gravitational forces, and the vastness of the desert. As the exhibition progresses, the focus shifts inward, toward human perception and longing: how we construct meaning through exploration, how absence, memory, and imagination shape what we see. Finally, the exhibition expands outward again, toward the sky — to the Moon as both a real celestial body and an enduring symbol of distance, dreams, and discovery.

Set in Abu Dhabi, under the light of the very Moon that has inspired poets, scientists, and dreamers for millennia, The Other Side of the Moon invites viewers to reflect on what connects the known and the unknown. The exhibition echoes, quietly but insistently, the spirit of exploration and reflection. In that subtle tension between technology and poetry, between outer space and inner gravity, it challenges us to reconsider what we choose to illuminate — and what we leave in shadow.

Latifa Saeed works between installation, sculpture and design. Her environmental approach articulates different ecosystems including natural, urban and technological. Her works most often seek a specific poetics of science; inviting us to dwell between the city, the desert and the stars. Her new installation Dust Devils, offers a never seen before technological and sensory experience based on a fundamental cosmogonic narrative. Referring to the mysteries of nature in the age of global warming, rooted in a cultural language that has evolved from the UAE's distinct desert landscape, the installation organizes in three different devices: a smoke machine, LCD screen and an electro-magnetic device. Each translates an atmospheric phenomenon that can be experienced in the desert, through various whirlpools and tornados, where water tornado, air tornado, electromagnetic sand tornado and fire tornado come together. These natural elements metaphorize in a special soundscape composed by the artist and spread at each side of the installation space. Saeed invites us into an sensory experience made of vibrations and spectral images more than anthropomorphic or recognizable representations. In doing so she presents a reminder of the fragility and resilience of the traditional landscape in the critical age of Anthropocene.






Abdus Salaam Insaan: human being Chapters 1 – 3 series, 2022


The word Insaan translates as human being. Ie word's roots are uns, meaning 'intimate' or 'love', and nasyia), meaning 'forgetful', de"ning the human being as both the intimate one and the forgetful one. Iis poetic fragrance is often alluded to by the mystics and scholars of Islam as it so poignantly delivers us to the essence of humanity being that of love, a reality that we often forget within our terrestrial, ethereal and Divine planes. Is body of work, made over the course of six weeks in residence during the month-long fast of Ramadan, ties this land and its hominid remains, this river and its polluted state, notions of our global environmental shortcomings alongside intimate and personal moments. It asks if perhaps love — or the reminder of it, being the essence of our being and therefore our sanctuary across multiple planes — might ease the anxieties, tensions, and personal fears that we project outwardly into the echo chamber of forgetfulness.




Adsum is an artwork created by Eduardo Kac in 2019 that explores presence beyond the Earth through the medium of space travel. The title Adsum (Latin for "I am here" or "I am present") encapsulates the core idea of the work: affirming human presence across cosmic distances. In 2024, Adsum was transported to the Moon as part of a private lunar mission. Its successful landing on the Moon marked a groundbreaking moment in the history of space art. By sending a work of art to the lunar surface, Kac expanded the notion of artistic presence, redefining the limits of where and how art can exist. Adsum not only engages with themes of space exploration and communication but also represents a poetic extension of humanity's cultural presence beyond Earth, offering a visionary bridge between art, science, and extraterrestrial environments.


H.E. Dr. Obaid Al Ketbi
